

Outcome Based Education (OBE)

Political Science (PO, PO, PSOs)

Program Objective

1. The students who opt for BA Political Science generally are the ones who wish to get exposed to the core of several disciplines instead of moving towards specialization in one. The course has been designed to teach them the core areas of political Science such as political theory, Indian constitution, and international relations.
2. The aim is not just to impart them factual and theoretical information but to develop critical faculty of their mind to enable them to think and reflect on the political issues and phenomenon objectively.
3. The course module seeks to acquaint students of the functioning of the Indian Political System and how India manages its broad national interests in global politics.

Program Outcome

1. Understand Political Theories, Philosophy and Inter related with sub social sciences and concepts of Law, Liberty, Equality and Marxian Theories.
2. Increase knowledge of Ancient and Modern Governments, Constitutions and different kind of government, Law making process and Judiciary system in India.
3. Increase knowledge of the Western and Indian political thought of the fundamental values and ethical issues contested in politics over time and of alternative moral and ethical frameworks for interpreting and evaluating contemporary political discourses.
4. Analyse the Powers and Functions of the president, Prime Minister and Judiciary system of UK, USA, France, Swiss, China, Japan, Malaysia and Indian Central-State Administration and Local Self Government.
5. Understand the Indian Social Movements and Political Parties, issues of Jammu Kashmir and North East Areas.
6. Analyse comparison of Political Parties in Jharkhand.
7. Understand the Approaches, Principles, concepts of Public Administration and E-Governance in India.
8. Understand the Powers and Functions of International Organizations, Peace keeping with developing countries.
9. Explain the policy making process, Social Welfare Schemes, to aware citizens' rights and duties and activities of NGO's.
10. Understanding of Political Science research and analytical skills, including the ability to think critically; to construct logical arguments; to collect, analyse, and interpret evidence and data; and to formulate reasoned conclusions.
