



St. Xavier's College, Simdega, has been filled with immense potential since its inception. Therefore, the college management and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell have thoughtfully formulated its vision and mission.

Drawing on the Jesuit approach to education, we have set as our

vision and mission the true pursuit of knowledge for the service and advancement of the world. We also place special importance on fostering harmony between human beings and human beings and between human beings and nature, while preserving the dignity, uniqueness, and potential of each individual.

The geographical location of St. Xavier's College, Simdega, makes it even more unique. It borders Gumla to the north, Khunti and West Singhbhum to the east, Odisha (Sundargarh district) to the south, and Chhattisgarh (Jashpur district) to the west. A large number of students come from these areas to receive quality education.

Simdega is a tribal-dominated district with a population of approximately 600,000. Dropouts in higher education have long been a problem in this district. The reasons for these dropouts are poverty, lack of awareness, and poor-quality educational institutions throughout the region. With these goals in mind, St. Xavier's College was opened in Simdega on August 1, 2016. The college's vision and mission were to provide state-of-the-art, skill-based education, especially to talented students from the poor, backward, and marginalized communities of the region.

Our vision is to create secular, democratic and authentic personalities in the students. For this, under the aegis of IQAC, programs related to in-depth

knowledge of the subject and skill development are organized for the students throughout the year.

Language and culture are the essence of any society. Therefore, we strive to preserve them and continually enhance them. We have a majority of tribal students. This opens up immense possibilities for the promotion and research of their mother tongues—Kudukh, Kharia, Mundari, Santhali, and Nagpuri. To take the cultural heritage of Jharkhand to the global level, IQAC is planning to conduct special programmes from the year 2026 for the preservation and promotion of the language, culture and folk beliefs, faiths and tribalism of Jharkhand. There is also a plan to soon build a museum for the preservation of primitive art culture.

Teachers are the foundation of any educational institution. We have seven departments with a total of 31 teachers. All are well-versed in their respective subjects and have passed a selection process. However, to maintain excellence, they need to update and modernize their knowledge and teaching skills. IQAC is taking this seriously and implementing a policy to send faculty members to higher education training programs. They are being encouraged to maintain the trend of writing more articles/books and presenting research papers in national/international seminars. With the visionary thinking of the college principal, IQAC has been successfully organizing progressive programmes.

After continuous discussions with the college management, IQAC deeply recognized the acute lack of quality postgraduate education in Simdega. This gap was addressed by Ranchi University. The university accepted our demands and granted permission to offer postgraduate courses in 2023. Now, our talented students are earning their postgraduate degrees at a low cost while staying in Simdega.

There is a complete lack of good education in science subjects in Simdega and its nearby border districts. To overcome this deficiency, permission has been sought from Ranchi University for teaching science subjects. The necessary steps have been taken for

this. It is hoped that science courses will begin here in 2026.

Thirteen clubs - (Environmental Club, Literary Club, Dance Club, Drama Club, Music Club, Sports Club, Indigenous Club, Photography Club, Chaplin Club, Quiz Club, Media Club, Painting Club and Entrepreneurship Club), six committees (Culture Committee, Games Committee, Quiz Committee, Exam Committee, Literary Committee, Discipline Committee), three societies (History Society, Literary Society, Film Society) and two cells (Women Cell, ST/SC/OBC Cell) are functioning under the supervision of IQAC to conduct quality programmes throughout the year in the college.

Apart from this, every Saturday all the seven departments of the college - English Department, Hindi Department, History Department, Geography Department, Economics Department, Political Science Department and Commerce Department organize special programmes related to education and creative development for their students. These programs aim to provide students with an

engaging education. They are based on the New Education Policy's concept of 'Learning by doing'. These programs are a type of outreach program. The programs place a special emphasis on experiential and practical learning. Analysis has shown that these specialized programs enhance students' critical thinking, foster a greater interest in research, and enhance their creative potential. In doing so, we are moving closer to the core spirit of our mission, "LUCENS ET ARDENS," which means "Let your light shine."

St. Xavier's College is in Simdega, a remote tribal dominated border area, so that the students of Simdega and surrounding areas could get the same modern, quality, skill development-based education.

We not only hope but have full confidence that our students coming out from here will play an important role in building the society and the country. On behalf of IQAC, I extend my heartfelt thanks to all the stakeholders for your qualitative participation for quality governance and administration of the College.


The Environmental and Energy Audit



1. Academic Curriculum

Academic Credit Courses

St. Xavier's College, Simdega is an affiliated college of Ranchi University. The college follows the guidelines and instruction of Ranchi University. We have received temporary permission from Ranchi University and Temporary Affiliation from the Director of Higher Education for the Year:

- AISHE-2023-24, 2024-25 have been completed.

Without any deviation, the college is focussed on the academic curriculum prescribed by Ranchi University. Teachers engaged themselves in teaching meticulously and completed the syllabus by time. Need-based revisions were done. Assignments, library hours, quizzes, presentations, field work, and written exams were components of the mid semester examination. The results were very satisfactory.

Certificate Credit Courses:

The college strives to impart vocational and training-based knowledge to every student and award with certification. During 2024-25, 3 certificate courses were introduced for the students:

Curriculum Facilities and Follow-Up

- The curriculum framework is well-designed and uploaded on the website. Lesson Plans for all NEP/ CBCS/UG/PG courses are well-drafted by the teachers and uploaded on the website for use.
- The Departmental Yearly Plan is prepared at the beginning of the year and strictly followed by the departments.

2. Faculty Resources in the College

The college is rich in its human resources. During the year 2024-2025, the College has appointed 5 Assistant Professors (Accounts -2, Geography-2, History-1), 2 peons and 1 Lab Technician. There are 31 teaching staff and 24 administrative and supporting staff.

All Faculty members are UGC-NET qualified. There are 10 faculty members with Ph.D. degrees, which is 32% of the total teaching strength. The total number of students is 2156. The faculty-student Ratio is 1:25 in classes, 1:50 in the departments, and 1:60 in the college.

The years of experience of teachers in the institution is 9 Years, while the average experience in the Institution is 5 Years.

The purchase mechanism is properly developed and practiced by staff and students. The Finance mechanism for receipts and payments is well-monitored. The college added 20.12lakh to its building assets in the previous year.

4. Financial Resources & Management

The financial Statements for 2024-25 were audited on time under Xaviers Ranchi, a registered Society, by Chartered Accountant B.K. Bank. As per audit report 2024-25, the Ratio of Capital Income Vs Capital Expenditure was found to be balanced. Financial controls and risk management measures are implemented to safeguard the fiancés of the college. Annual financial audits ensure transparency and accountability.

The financial position of the College for the year 2025 is sound and encouraging. The statement of Income and Expenditure 2024-25 suggest demands for better financial control and risk management to establish proper financial establishment for the Institution.

We have a well-drafted, need-based master plan for short term, medium term, and long-term Institutional Development (IDP). As a Xaverian family, we continue journeying towards the vision and mission of St. Xavier's College, Simdega under the umbrella of Xaviers Ranchi as registered Society, Ranchi Jesuit Society as a Mother Province of the Society of Jesuit, a Catholic Religious Order.

There was a little hurry in completing the syllabus and in selection of subjects, specially about the minor papers, due to delayed communication by the university.

The college has a well-structured Time Table to ensure classes in a disciplined manner. Assignments, exams, presentations, group discussions and library hours were incorporated to assess student learning and progression.
